Our special project for this season will be a focus on Hispanic music. With this effort we continue to foster our mission of introducing our choristers to the music of many cultures while at the same time reaching out to the wider community in Fairfield County. I am pleased to announce that the FCCC is the recipient of a grant from the CT Commission on Culture & Tourism in the amount of \$5356. After a rigorous evaluation process which looked at all aspects of our organization and program, we are proud to have been recognized by the state of Connecticut as an outstanding cultural organization. Many thanks to Beau Villecco for making this happen!

In July our Chamber Singers traveled to Canada to participate in the Niagara International Music Festival. We performed our own repertoire in two concerts and additional repertoire as part of the massed festival choir which was directed by Francisco Nunez of the Young People's Chorus of New York. Eight choirs from Ohio, Iowa, Pennsylvania, New York, Ontario and New Brunswick worked together for the five days of the festival. In addition to visiting Niagara Falls, the Welland Canal and the town of Niagara-on-the-Lake, we had a great time playing Frisbee, water polo, dancing to a Jamaican band and just hanging out together! ## Letters

*This past summer, the FCCC Chamber singers traveled to Canada for the Niagara International Music Festival. It was an amazing experience for all of the kids. I started the FCCC in my freshman year in high school where I entered straight into Chamber. I didn't realize how fun, thrilling and yet demanding this choir would be. It was just what I needed.*

*When we finally loaded up the bus and hit the road for Canada everyone was so excited. All of our hard work was about to pay off. Our expectations were high and our anticipation of hearing the other choirs was growing with each hour on the bus. We arrived at our destination on the Niagara College campus. We rushed off the bus to get ready for our first brief performance for all the other choirs. We were very proud of our performance. The third night in Canada was our own extended performance. Unfortunately, some of us felt that our performance was not up to par. Although many people were very proud of us and also extremely impressed, we were not so thrilled. On the bus after our performance, Mr. Noyes asked us to speak up and tell the choir what we thought. By the time it was my turn to speak we were back at the college so Mr. Noyes said that we could finish the conversation the next night. I then asked him if we could finish it that night instead because all of our heads were crammed with thoughts about our concert.*

*A few of us gathered around outside the dorm rooms to finish what we had started. That night we had about an hour and a half of free time and we assumed that most of the choir would take that time to play. To our surprise, the entire choir was sitting with us about 10 minutes into our free time. We were also joined by the chaperones and the parents who were there. It was amazing to see the closeness of the choir. When given an hour to do what they wanted to do, everyone wanted to be together to talk about our experiences. It was an amazing meeting. I felt so good knowing how close we all were to be able to share everything that people did. We took time to evaluate our performance along with the performances of the other choirs. Our conversation took a personal turn when kids shared their feelings about how they felt about how Chamber was like a family to them. It is so true. Chamber is a very warm loving group that is like a family. We all care about each other. We take care of each other whenever we need to. I am very sad that it will be my last year in Chamber because I know I'll never find anything else like it.*


